GANDALL**

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose spent most of her formative years in Honolulu; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from Kamehameha School as a member of the Class of 1954, Auntie Rose worked on Hickam Air Force Base, where she met her husband Patrick Gandall; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose and Patrick Gandall were married November 4, 1956, at Hickam Air Force Base, Pearl Harbor; and

WHEREAS, Because of Patrick's military duty, Auntie Rose Gandall traveled with her husband from Hawai'i to Reese Air Force Base in Lubbock, Texas, to Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines, and then to George Air Force Base in Victorville, California in 1963, and finally ending up at Vandenberg Air Force Base in California in 1972; and

WHEREAS, the Gandall family eventually settling and taking up permanent residence in Huntington Beach, California; and

WHEREAS, while raising a family, Auntie Rose Gandall pursued careers in both the medical and dental fields, and retired as a dental assistant; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall loved her family deeply and was always ready with encouragement and loving words for them, sometimes a joke or two thrown in; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall will always be remembered for her energy that radiated in her constant laughter, ever-present smile, and feisty vitality that kept everyone going and on their toes; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall loved taking care of her beautiful blooming garden and taking her daily walks; and.

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall is survived by her children, Patrick, Jr. and wife Cres, Alan and wife Chris, Kanoe and husband Bryan, and her grandchildren Kimo, Keoni, Kawika and Kalani, and her sisters Nani Silva and Jackie Harris, and many nieces and nephews; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall was a dedicated, loyal and hard working member of the 'Ahahui 'o Lili'uokalani Hawaiian Civic Club of Southern California for many years; and

WHEREAS, Auntie Rose Gandall will always be "Sweet Sixteen"; and

WHEREAS, on the morning of January 25, 2018, Auntie Rose Gandall was called up by our Lord in Heaven.
